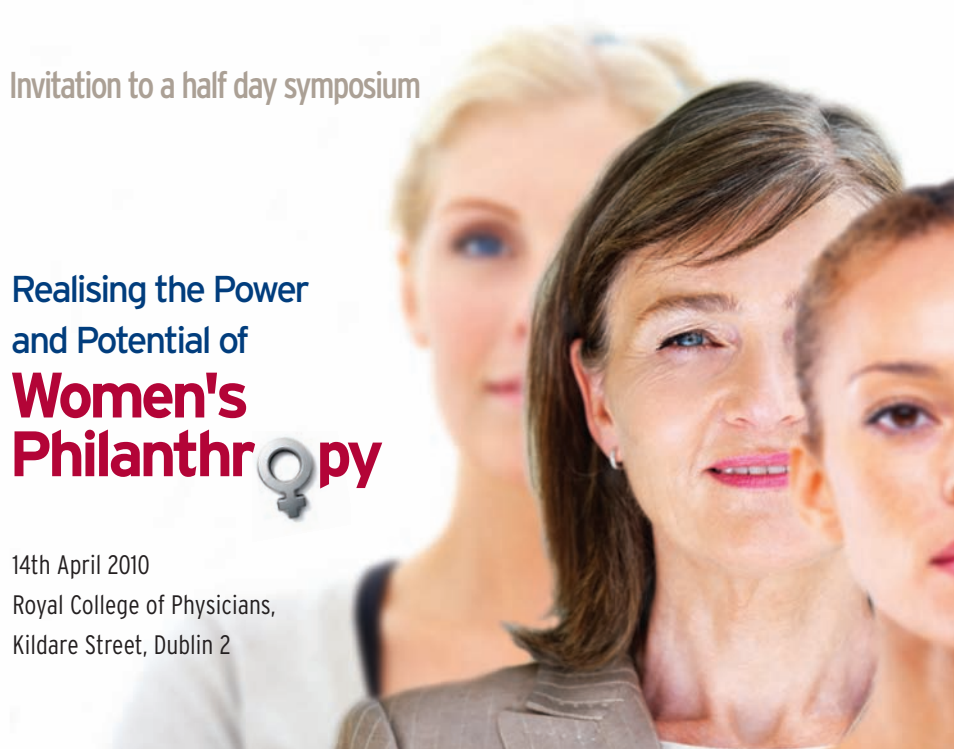

Speaker Biographies

Deirdre Mortell is Co-Founder and Chief Executive of the One Foundation, a venture philanthropy fund based in Dublin. She has held a number of senior communications and fundraising roles in Irish charitable organisations and has worked with Barnardos Ireland, Oxfam Ireland and served as Chair of the Irish Charities Tax Reform Group. Deirdre sits on a number of Boards, including Philanthropy Ireland and the European Venture Philanthropy Association.

Chantal McCabe was named the 2009 National Philanthropist of the Year by The Community Foundation for Ireland. Chantal's vision and generous seed funding resulted in the founding of three organisations: Social Innovations Ireland, The Immigrant Council of Ireland and Young Social Innovators (YSI). In addition to her initial investments, Chantal continues to support these organisations at the Board level and as an ongoing volunteer.

Ellen Remmer is President and CEO of The Philanthropic Initiative, Inc. Ellen works directly with donor clients—families, independent foundations and corporations—to create focused, strategic giving programmes and practical governance structures, and with community foundations and financial services firms to strengthen their capacity to help private donors realise their philanthropic goals. She also serves both as a board member of her family's foundation, which supports programmes that help disadvantaged girls take charge of their lives, and her family business, EHR Investments.
