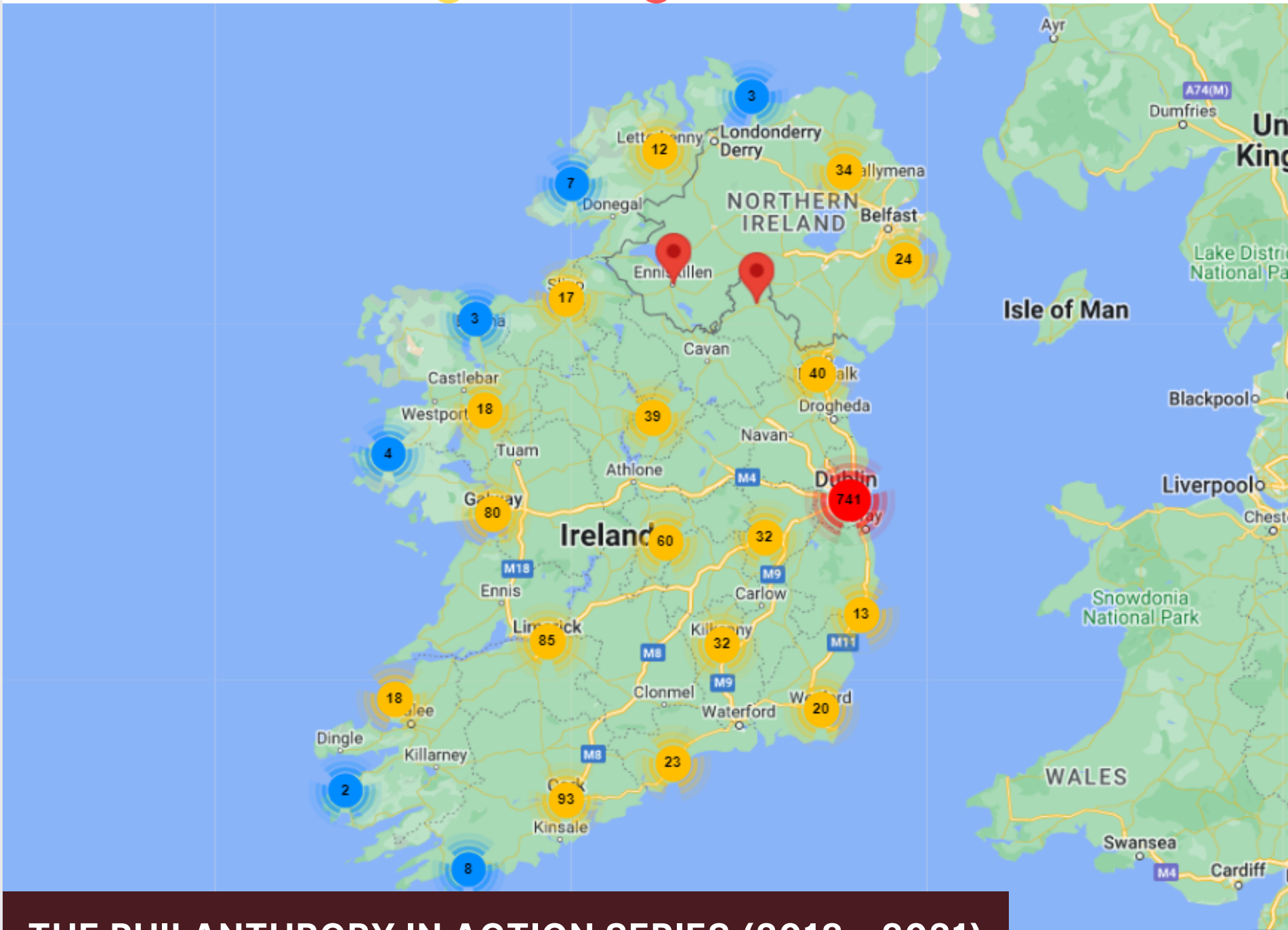

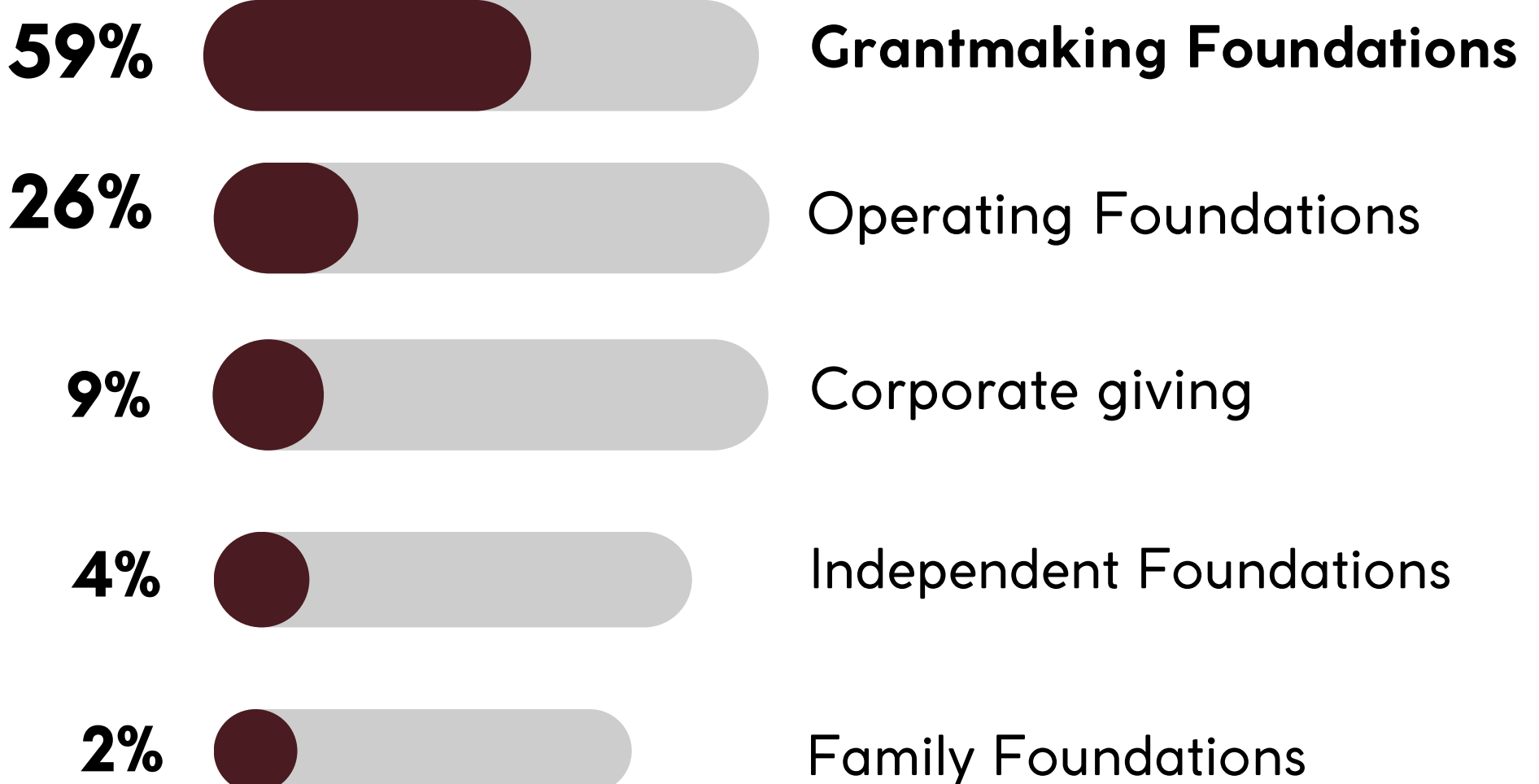

Percentage contribution towards grant support for SDGs



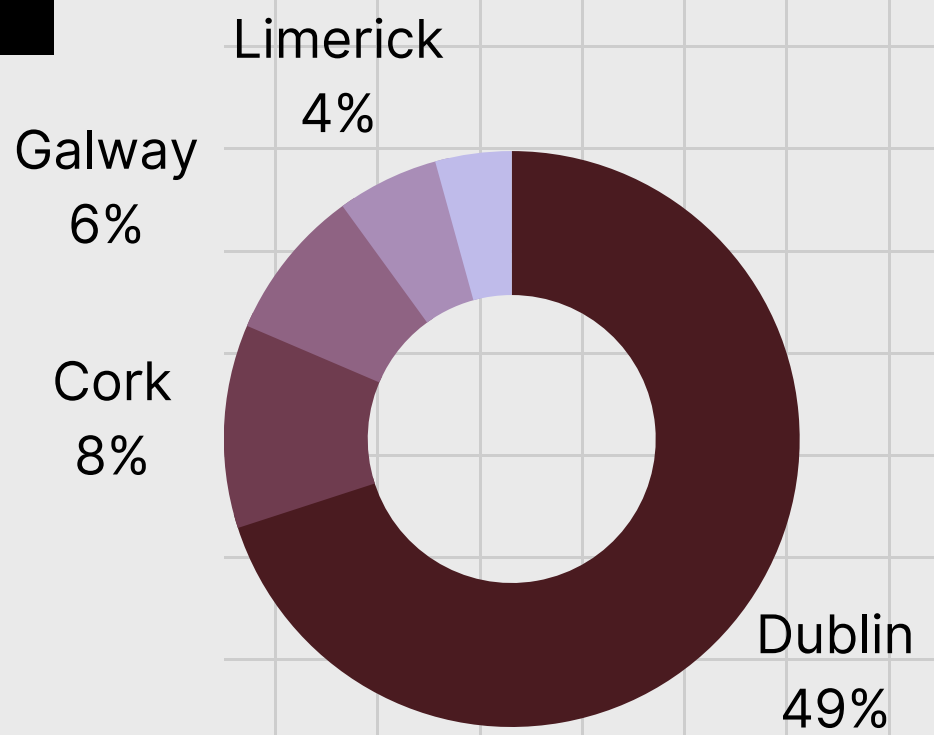

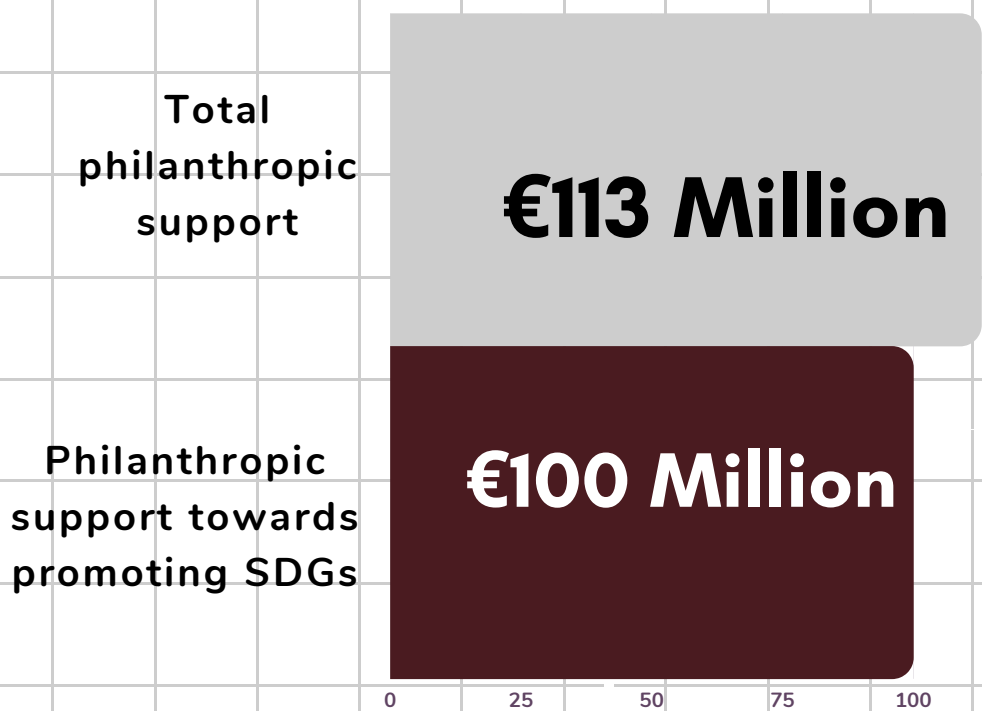

**Most projects** advancing SDGs were located in **Dublin**.

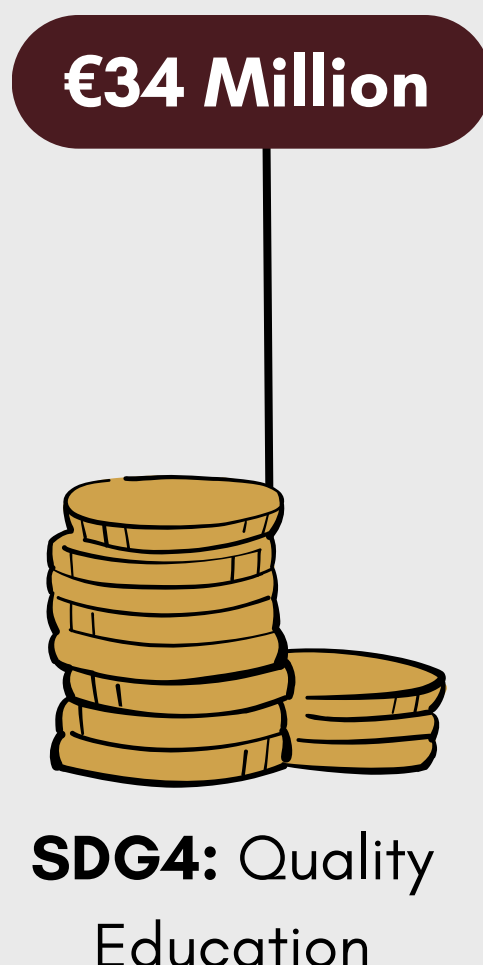
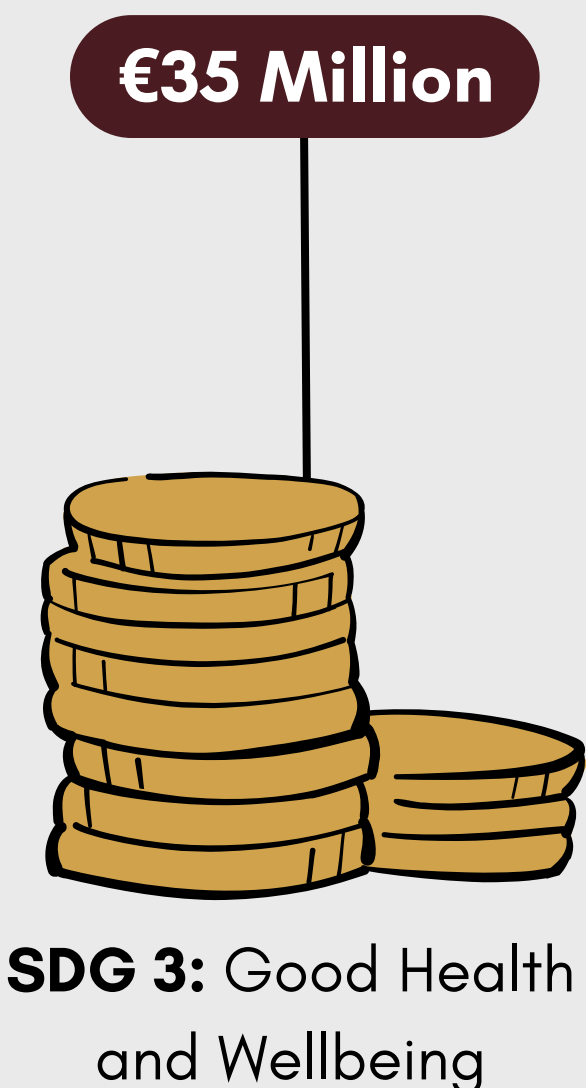


## HOW MUCH?

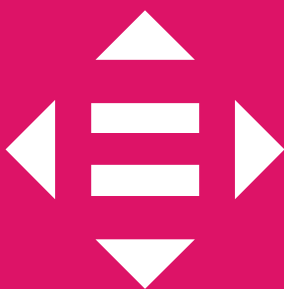

## GLOSSARY

- **Foundation:** A non-governmental, non-profit organisation with assets provided by a donor or donors. It is administered by its own officers and expends its income for public benefit. There is no distinct legal definition of a 'foundation'. Most frequently 'foundation' or 'trust' is used to interchangeably to describe charities with private, independent and sustainable income that fulfil their purposes by funding or otherwise supporting individuals or other organisations.
- **Independent Foundation:** A foundation that is usually founded by private resources, often by bequest. They are occasionally termed "non-operating" because they do not run their own programs.
- **Family Foundation:** A foundation whose funds are derived from members of a single family. One or more family members play a significant role in governing and/or managing the foundation throughout its life.
- **Grantmaking Foundations:** A self-governing foundation that uses their income to make grants to other charitable organisations for projects as prescribed in the terms of their establishment.
- **Corporate giving:** Philanthropic giving that a profit-making company voluntarily undertakes to responsibly manage and account for its impact on society.
- **Operating Foundation:** A foundation that uses the bulk of their income to provide charitable services or to run charitable programs of their own. They make few, if any, grants to outside organisation.
